Carrier Airborne Early Warning Squadron ELEVEN, Detachment BRAVO is one of several similar detachments aboard CVA's in the West Pacific. In a real sense, BRAVO is a "squadron within a squadron" operating as an integral unit remaining only under the administrative control of the Parent Squadron at the North Island Naval Air Station in San Diego.

Flying the Grumman E-1B "Tracer," Detachment BRAVO provides Airborne Early Warning for the Task Force with its powerful RADAR. Under the watchful eyes of highly-trained controllers, unidentified air and surface contacts are readily detected, intercepted by Combat Air Patrol aircraft and quickly identified and/or destroyed.

Detachment BRAVO, under LCDR Paul H. Mozley as Officer-in-Charge, is 12 Officers, 38 Enlisted and 3 "Willy Fudds" strong.

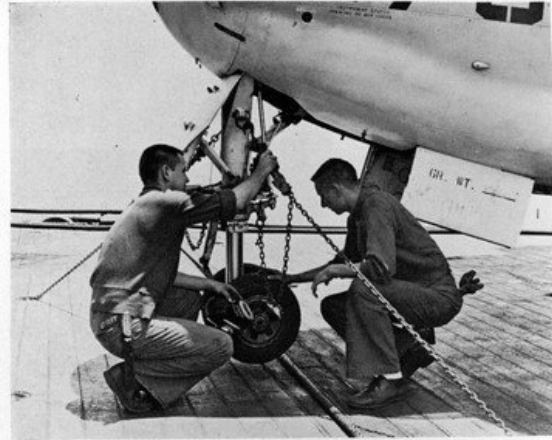

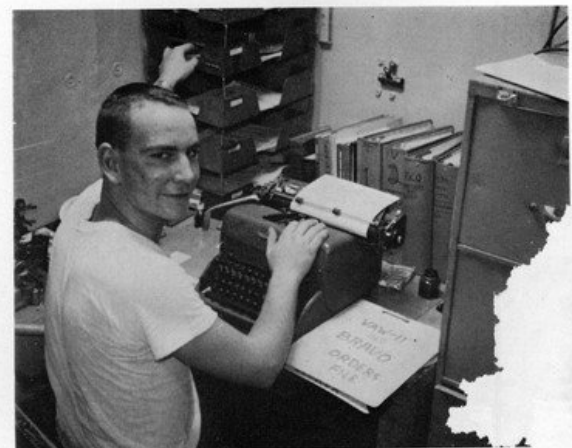

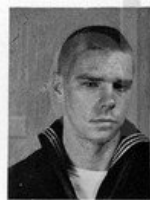
